
METHODOLOGY APPLIED

- Qualitative
 - Amedeo Giorgi's Descriptive Phenomenological Method in Psychology
 - Naiveté during interview
 - Gain a sense of the whole experience
 - Individual meaning units
 - Essences

METHODOLOGY APPLIED

- Purposive Sample
 - Emergency Nurses currently working in an emergency department with three or more years of emergency nursing experience
 - Obtained through snowball technique
- Research question:
 - As an emergency nurse, what is it like to work with other emergency nurses?
