Patient Advisory Board Responsibilities

- Advise the research team about study design, approach and outcomes
- Identify gaps important to you in existing care
- Present your views and preferences for use of technology and integration into care
- Pilot/test the technology and platform- provide feedback
- **♦ Attend quarterly meetings** (~ 2 hours each)
- Attend conferences to learn about latest technology and trends in care that may be useful in the project
- * Assist team to interpret data and disseminate research findings

Patient Advisory Board Contributions

- Advised the research team in design
 - Survey questions and burden for participants
 - How to structure the coaching
 - Testing and feedback on technology
 - >Training the nurse coaches providing feedback on coaching
 - How to engage participants and keep them engaged
- * Assist team to interpret data and disseminate research findings
 - Focus group data interpretation
 - >Co-presenting at conferences on patient engagement in research

Key contributions for this project from advisors

- Influencing systems: promotes understanding of systems issues/logistics/culture so that study design aligns and addresses barriers
- Influencing people: credibility with expert consultation, opening doors to other stakeholders, creating a buzz and priority for the project
- Influencing implementation: anticipating and addressing barriers, identifying opportunities

Preparing a competitive proposal

- Two review criteria: patient-centered outcomes and stakeholder engagement
- Recognition of patients in implementation plan and budget
- PCORI Patient Engagement Officer and direct reporting from Patient Advisory Board to PCORI
